I confess to almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done and in what I have failed to do, through my fault, through my fault, through my most grievous fault; therefore I ask blessed Mary ever-Virgin, all the Angels and Saints, and you, my brothers and sisters, to pray for me to the Lord our God.

The principal celebrant says:

May almighty God have mercy on us, forgive us our sins, and bring us to everlasting life. R/. Amen.

LITURGY OF THE WORD

We now listen to the word of Scripture – light from the Holy Spirit, who speaks through human voices so as to make our intellect come to know and contemplate, to strengthen our will and make our desire for action effective. And because we are one people, "gathered together in the unity of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit," we recite the Creed, affirming the unity of our faith.

A reading from the book of Genesis

At the time when the Lord God made earth and heaven there was as yet no wild bush on the earth nor had any wild plant yet sprung up, for the Lord God had not sent rain on the earth, nor was there any man to till the soil. Then he breathed into his nostrils a breath of life, and thus man became a living being.

CREED

At the end of the homily, the Symbol or Profession of Faith or Creed, when prescribed, is said

I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible. I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ, the only Begotten Son of God, born of the Father before all ages. God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, consubstantial with the Father; through him all things were made. For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven,

and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary and became man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and was buried, and rose again on the third day in accordance with the Scriptures. He ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead and his kingdom will have no end. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son he is adored and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets. I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. I confess one baptism for the forgiveness of sins and I look forward to the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come. Amen.

PRAYERS OF THE FAITHFUL

The principal celebrant introduces the general intercessions:

For the Holy Father, Pope Francis, whom the Lord has chosen as successor of Peter and Pastor of the flock of Christ, and for his intentions. May God grant him many years of life and fill him with the wisdom, consolation and strength of the Holy Spirit in his unceasing apostolic ministry of service to Christians and to all people. Lord, hear us.

R/. Lord, graciously hear us.

For the Arch(bishop) of N, NN, the Bishops of Uganda, the Prelate of Opus Dei, Fernando, and all the priests of the Church: that, enlightened by the grace of the Spirit of Wisdom and with the example of Saint Josemaría, they may be authentic witnesses of the Word of Truth and Life, and strive constantly with untiring action to spread the kingdom of God. All recite the Hail Mary

The principal celebrant says:

O God, through the Blessed Virgin Mary, you granted countless graces to your priest Saint Josemaría, choosing him as a most faithful instrument to found Opus Dei. Grant that we may all learn to turn all the circumstances and events of our life into opportunities to love you and to serve the Church, the Pope and all souls, lighting up the paths of the earth and bringing consolation and hope to the hungry, the sick, the ignorant and defenceless. Through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

LITURGY OF THE EUCHARIST

Then, the offering: the bread and wine of men. It is very little, but it is accompanied by prayer: "Lord God, we ask you to receive us and be pleased with the sacrifice we offer you with humble and contrite hearts: and that the sacrifice which today we offer you, O God, our Lord, may be brought to your presence and be made acceptable." Again, a reminder of our smallness and of the desire to cleanse and purify all that is offered to God.

Meanwhile the celebrant says the offertory prayers.

Standing at the altar, the celebrant takes the paten with the bread and, holding it slightly raised above the altar, says:

Blessed are you, Lord God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the bread we offer you: fruit of the earth and work of human hands, it will become for us the bread of life.

The people answer (if singing is in progress, this response is omitted):

R/. Blessed be God for ever.

A priest pours wine and a little water into the chalice, saying silently:

By the mystery of this water and wine may we come to share in the divinity of Christ who humbled himself to share in our humanity.

Then the celebrant takes the chalice and raises it a little above the altar saying:

Blessed are you, Lord, God of all creation, for through your goodness we have received the wine we offer you: fruit of the vine and work of human hands, it will become our spiritual drink.

The people answer (if singing is in progress, this response is omitted):

R/. Blessed be God for ever.

The celebrant bows and says silently:

With humble spirit and contrite heart may we be accepted by you, O Lord, and may our sacrifice in your sight this day be pleasing to you, Lord God.

The celebrant then washes his hands at the side of the altar, saying silently:

Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.

[STAND]

The celebrant says:

Pray brethren (brothers and sisters), that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God, the Almighty Father.

R/. May the Lord accept the sacrifice at your hands for the praise and glory of his name, for our good and the good of all his holy Church.

PRAYER OVER THE OFFERINGS

The principal celebrant says:

Holy Father, accept these gifts that we offer in memory of Saint Josemaría, so that, through the sacrifice offered by Christ on the altar of the Cross and made present here in this sacrament, you may graciously sanctify all that we do. Through Christ our Lord.

R/. Amen.

PREFACE OF PASTORS

I adore and praise with the angels - it is not difficult, because I know that, as I celebrate the holy Mass, they surround me, adoring the Blessed Trinity. And I know that in some way the Blessed Virgin is there, because of her intimate relationship with the most Blessed Trinity and because she is the Mother of Christ, of his flesh and blood - the Mother of Jesus Christ, perfect God and perfect man. Jesus was conceived in the womb of Mary most holy, not through the intervention of man, but by the power of the Holy Spirit alone. In his veins runs the blood of his Mother, the blood that is offered in the sacrifice of the redemption, on Calvary and in the Mass. The Lord be with you.

R/. And with your spirit.

Lift up your hearts.

R/. We lift them up to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

R/. It is right and just.

It is truly right and just, our duty and our salvation, always and everywhere to give you thanks, Lord, Holy Father, almighty and eternal God, through Christ our Lord. For, as on the festival of Saint Josemaría you bid your Church rejoice, so, too, you strengthen her by the example of his holy life, teach her by his words of preaching, and keep her safe in answer to his prayers. And so, with the company of Angels and Saints, we sing the hymn of your praise, and acclaim without end:

EUCHARISTIC PRAYER III

The moment of the consecration draws near. Now, in the Mass, it is Christ who acts again, through the priest: "This is my body"..."This is the cup of my blood." Jesus is with us! The transubstantiation is a renewal of the miracle of God's infinite love. When that moment takes place again today, let us tell our Lord, without any need for words, that nothing will be able to separate us from him; that, as he puts himself into our hands, defenceless, under the fragile appearances of bread and wine, he has made us his willing slaves. **PC:** You are indeed Holy, O Lord, and all you have created rightly gives you praise, for through your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, by the power and working of the Holy Spirit, you give life to all things and make them holy, and you never cease to gather a people to yourself, so that from the rising of the sun to its setting a pure sacrifice may be offered to your name.

CC: Therefore, O Lord, we humbly implore you: by the same Spirit graciously make holy these gifts we have brought to you for consecration, that they may become

the Body and + Blood of your Son our Lord Jesus Christ, at whose command we celebrate these mysteries.

For on the night he was betrayed, he himself took bread, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:

TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND EAT OF IT, FOR THIS IS MY BODY, WHICH WILL BE GIVEN UP FOR YOU.

The bell is rung as the celebrant elevates the Host to be seen by the people. He then genuflects.

In a similar way, when supper was ended, he took the chalice, and, giving you thanks, he said the blessing, and gave the chalice to his disciples, saying:

TAKE THIS, ALL OF YOU, AND DRINK FROM IT, FOR THIS IS THE CHALICE OF MY BLOOD, THE BLOOD OF THE NEW AND ETERNAL COVENANT, WHICH WILL BE POURED OUT FOR YOU AND FOR MANY FOR THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS. DO THIS IN MEMORY OF ME. The bell is rung as the celebrant elevates the Chalice to be seen by the people. He then genuflects.

PC: The mystery of faith.

 ${\bf R}/.$ We proclaim your Death, O Lord, and profess your Resurrection untill you come again.

CC: Therefore, O Lord, as we celebrate the memorial of the saving Passion of your Son, his wondrous Resurrection and Ascension into heaven, and as we look forward to his second coming, we offer you in thanksgiving this holy and living sacrifice.

Look, we pray, upon the oblation of your Church and, recognizing the sacrificial Victim by whose death you willed to reconcile us to yourself, grant that we, who are nourished by the Body and Blood of your Son and filled with his Holy Spirit, may become one body, one spirit in Christ.

1C: May he make of us an eternal offering to you, so that we may obtain an inheritance with your elect, especially with the most Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, with blessed Joseph, her Spouse, with your blessed Apostles and glorious Martyrs, with Saint Josemaría and with all the Saints, on whose constant intercession in your presence we rely for unfailing help.

2C: May this sacrifice of our reconciliation, we pray, O Lord, advance the peace and salvation of all the world.

Be pleased to confirm in faith and charity your pilgrim Church on earth, with your servant Francis, our Pope and the (Arch) bishop of N, NN, the Prelate of Opus Dei, Fernando, the Order of Bishops, all the clergy, and the entire people you have gained for your own. Listen graciously to the prayers of this family, whom you have summoned before you: in your compassion, O merciful Father, gather to yourself all your children scattered throughout the world.

To our departed brothers and sisters and to all who were pleasing to you at their passing from this life, give kind admittance to your kingdom. There we hope to enjoy for ever the fullness of your glory

He joins his hands

through Christ our Lord, through whom you bestow on the world all that is good.

The celebrant takes the Chalice and the paten with the Host and, lifting them up, says:

PC: Through him, and with him, and in him, O God, almighty Father, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honour is yours, for ever and ever.

R/. Amen.

The choir sings the great Amen after the Doxology.

COMMUNION RITE

Jesus is the way, the mediator. In him are all things; outside of him is nothing. In Christ, taught by him, we dare to call God our Father - he is the Almighty who created heaven and earth, and he is a loving Father who waits for us to come back to him again and again, as the story of the prodigal son repeats itself in our lives.We are going to receive our Lord. On this earth, when we receive an important person, we bring out the best- lights, music, formal dress. How should we prepare to receive Christ into our soul? Have we ever thought about how we would behave if we could only receive him once in a lifetime? The principal celebrant says:

At the Saviour's command and formed by divine teaching, we dare to say:

R/. Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil.

The principal celebrant says:

Deliver us, Lord, we pray, from every evil, graciously grant peace in our days, that, by the help of your mercy, we may be always free from sin and safe from all distress, as we await the blessed hope and the coming of our Saviour, Jesus Christ.

R/. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours, now and for ever.

The principal celebrant says:

Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles: Peace I leave you, my peace I give you, look not on our sins, but on the faith of your Church, and graciously grant her peace and unity in accordance with your will. Who live and reign forever and ever.

R/. Amen.

The principal celebrant says:

The peace of the Lord be with you always.

R/. And with your spirit.

One of the celebrants says:

Let us offer each other the sign of peace.

All make an appropriate sign of peace, according to local custom.

The choir sings a hymn for the sign of peace.

The principal celebrant says:

Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb.

R/. Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word, and my soul shall be healed.

The principal celebrant says:

The Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.

The deacon then dismisses the people:

Go forth, the Mass is ended.

R/. Thanks be to God.

The Choir then sings a hymn to Our Lady.
